



A soap carving test can be a valuable tool for evaluating the fine motor skills, precision, and hand-eye coordination of dental technician candidates. To administer such a test, follow these instructions:

Materials Needed:

- Soap Blocks: Provide each candidate with a standardized soap block. Soap is a good material for this test because it is soft and easy to carve, similar to the materials dental technicians work with.

• End of Test: Announce when the time is up, and ask candidates to stop carving. Collect their soap carvings for evaluation.

Evaluation:
